## House Passes “Jobs” Bill, Highway and Transit Program Funding and Extension Included

By a vote of 217-212, the House of Representatives passed H.R. 2847, “Jobs for Main Street Act of 2010,” legislation intended to stimulate job growth. Included in the bill are funds for various infrastructure investments, including \$37.3 billion for transportation programs, of which \$27.5 billion is for highways (freight and passenger rail and port projects are also eligible for these funds); \$8.4 billion is for transit; \$500 million is for Airport Improvement Program grants; and \$800 million for

Amtrak fleet modernization. The highway funds will be distributed to states by the same formula that was used to distribute stimulus funds previously provided in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). States are not required to provide any matching dollars to be eligible to receive these funds. States would be required to have 50 percent of the funds under contract within 90 days or lose the remaining funds (to be redistributed to states that have met this requirement). The second 50 percent must be under contract within one year or be lost to other successful states. This is a far more stringent requirement than ARRA which

required funds to be “obligated” rather than under contract. The bill also places new “Buy American” requirements on transportation projects. Many of the other provisions related to the use of ARRA funds are included. These funds are provided on top of funding that comes through the traditional program.

Also included in the bill is an extension of highway and transit program authorization through Sept. 30, 2010 at current levels and provides additional Highway Trust Fund revenue to fund these programs. Since SAFETEA-LU expired on Sept. 30, 2009, these programs have been extended on a short-term basis at a funding level that is significantly below the FY 2009 authorized level. H.R. 2847 will increase funding by \$10.7 billion, nearly to the Fiscal Year 2009 authorized level. The bill also includes provisions to stabilize the Highway Trust Fund. It restores \$19.5 billion in interest payments foregone on the HTF’s previous cash balances, and restores authority for HTF balances to

receive interest payments in the future. The bill alters the way in which long-standing fuel tax exemptions provided to state and local governments are accounted for which are projected to increase HTF balances by about \$1.7 billion annually, for a total of \$9.8 billion over six years. In addition, as with the stimulus dollars, the legislation waives the requirement that states provide matching revenue to receive these funds.

The bill is not expected to be taken up in the Senate until after the first of the year. Until such time, another short term extension is required to ensure that program funding is not cut off, and, therefore, the House also passed a 60-day authorization and attached it to the Defense Department appropriation bill which the Senate must now approve. (A separate five-day extension was also necessary to allow the Senate time to act on the 60-day measure).

## **2010 Forecast: Tough Year Ahead** Residential rebounds while other sectors struggle

After three years of declines, the construction market may be poised for a rebound in 2010 thanks to an improving residential market, but designers and contractors in other building sectors may not have much to celebrate about.

McGraw-Hill Construction (MHC) is forecasting total construction starts will climb 11 percent, to \$466.2 billion, in 2010, following an

estimated 25 percent decline in 2009.

After a 39 percent drop in construction starts between 2006 and 2009, the overall U.S. construction market may show improvement in 2010 due to signs of strength in the residential market, as well as select public-works sectors, such as transportation and infrastructure, says Robert A. Murray, vice president of economic affairs for MHC. “This is not a booming market; it is just inching upward,” Murray says.

### **Single-Family Stability**

The main buoy for the industry is single-family housing, which could rise 30 percent to 560,000 starts in 2010 from an estimated 430,000 starts

in 2009. That would be on par with 2008, when 549,000 units were started.

Even with the rebound, the forecasted homebuilding activity in 2010 will be 65 percent below the mid-decade peak of the housing boom, Murray says. His residential forecast hinges on continued low mortgage rates and the extension of first-time homebuyer tax credits, he adds.

The outlook on multifamily housing remains mixed. Murray predicts a 14 percent rise in unit starts in 2010, to 160,000 units, from the 140,000 units started in 2009. Although the sector could rebound, activity remains only about a third of that in 2007, when 452,000 units were started.

Ed Sullivan, chief economist at the Portland Cement Association, is less optimistic about multifamily projects. He predicts a comeback will not be seen until 2011.

Although 2009 was a challenging year, the worst is yet to come in nonresidential building sectors, analysts forecast. According to MHC estimates, the commercial and manufacturing sectors will continue to struggle next year, with an estimated 6 percent drop in combined value of starts to \$55.5 billion – nearly half the level in 2007.

Sullivan sees that market sliding even further, down 22 percent in 2010. He does not expect a rebound until 2012. “If you look at vacancy rates, the job market, issues with credit – the fundamentals will take a while to come back,” he says.

Murray estimates office building starts will ease back another 3 percent in 2010, to \$19.7 billion, as employment remains weak and businesses curtail expansions.

As companies rein in travel expenses and consumers take fewer vacations, hotel

construction is feeling the impact. Occupancy fell 57 percent in the first eight months of 2009, while revenue per available room dropped 18.3 percent, according to Smith Travel Research, Hendersonville, Tenn. Murray expects hospitality starts to decline by 9 percent, to \$4.5 billion, in 2010.

Retail construction has been one of the biggest casualties of the economic crisis. Store and shopping center work hit an all-time high of 314 million square feet of starts in 2007, and has been falling ever since. Murray predicts 95 million sq ft of starts in 2010, a 5 percent drop from the 100 million sq ft in 2009. The 2010 level would be the lowest in nearly 50 years.

Retail will benefit from a rebound in residential building, says Ken Simonson, chief economist with Associated General Contractors of America. “New neighborhoods being built would create demand for local retail,” he says. “It would be modest amounts. I would not expect any big shopping center construction.”

The severe drop in demand for consumer goods pummeled the manufacturing sector. Murray says capacity utilization rates plummeted to 65.1 percent in June 2009 from 78.8 percent in December 2007, curtailing the need for new space. Murray estimates a 14 percent drop in 2010 starts, to \$9.4 billion, as capacity issues continue to hamper the sector.

### Going Public

Publicly funded projects are a wild card for many analysts. Simonson says the impact of cautious consumer spending, high unemployment and a drop in home values will be fully realized as tax revenue suffers in 2010. “State and local budgets are continuing to shrink as tax receipts fall short,” with many government agencies reducing their budget projections in the second half of 2009, Simonson says.

Education also is suffering. Murray says K-12

construction is likely to feel the pinch of lower property taxes, and higher-education projects are challenged to find funds because endowments dropped 20 percent in late 2008.

MHC estimates educational buildings starts dropped 23 percent in 2009, to 172 million sq ft, and it expects the sector to continue its downward path in 2010, with 158 million sq ft of new starts.

While state and local governments tighten their belts, many federally funded projects are on better footing. Funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) helped bolster highway construction starts in 2009. Total contracts for highways and bridges rose nearly \$4.4 billion in 2009, to \$57.3 billion. Still, much of the stimulus has yet to hit the street.

While a new federal highway bill remains on the horizon, many analysts expect federal highway funding to remain at current levels. With highway program funding flat and more stimulus yet to come, Murray forecasts a 13 percent rise in project starts, to \$64.7 billion.

Several megaprojects – including the \$1.6-billion Dulles Corridor Metrorail project in suburban Washington, D.C., and a new \$8.7-billion Trans-Hudson rail tunnel connecting New Jersey to Manhattan – have offered a big boost to the mass transit sector. MHC estimates that starts in 2009 jumped 29 percent, to \$5 billion, and predicts another 18 percent rise, to \$5.9 billion, in 2010. The prospect of billions of dollars of funding for high-speed rail projects also could fuel additional work in the coming years, Murray says.

Stimulus funds also could help buoy institutional building construction in 2010. Starts in the sector dropped 23 percent in square footage in 2009 and MHC forecasts the

sector will flatten out in 2010 with an additional drop of only 2 percent. Public buildings received a big boost from ARRA funding in 2009 and the sector will reap many of those benefits in 2010 as projects move forward. Starts are expected to rise 8 percent, to 51 million sq ft, on par with the 2007 peak.

Health care projects took a big hit in 2009 in light of the tight credit market, but they may be on the road to recovery. MHC estimates that the sector dropped 36 percent in 2009, to an estimated 70 million sq ft of new space. That sector is expected to have 72 million sq ft of new starts in 2010.

### Optimism

Simonson says he is “a bit more optimistic on health-care spending” going into 2010. “Now that the stock markets have rallied and the bond markets have opened, that will enable health care systems to resume their multi-year plans,” he says. “The demand is still there and, now, the money is there, too.”

Simonson says contractors will be particularly vulnerable in 2010 as most nonresidential sectors continue to suffer and many contractors complete their existing contracts. “I think 2010 will be an even more difficult year for most nonresidential contractors than 2009,” he says.

“A number of [contractors] still had backlogs that they worked through in 2009, but very few have enough to keep them busy through 2010,” Simonson explains. “Only a minority are going to be winning stimulus projects. It will be a tough year.”

Check the DTP website often for bid opportunities and stay updated with our weekly Procurement Alert which will list important dates and DBE goals for all upcoming packages. For DBEs looking to team with qualified primes, the bidders list is posted on the website for all major packages.

**Q: I am a minority business and LDBE and LSDBE certified. Does that count?**

**A:** To be considered a DBE-Disadvantaged Business Enterprise as it applies to the DCMP, you must be certified as a DBE in the state of Virginia by either Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority (MWAA) or the Virginia Department of Minority Business Enterprise (DMBE).
